Governance and Chair's report

5.1 Chair's report

BC informed the governors that this was his last meeting as Chair of Governors as he was planning to step down at the end of the academic year.

Further dates will be established once new Chair is elected.

Governors agreed to offer a standing invite to Governing Body meetings to Esther Quinn and Amy Clarkson over the next academic year.

Succession planning and potential candidates to take over as Chair were discussed.

Headteacher appointment

AP gave a report of the Headteacher appointment campaign. 10 applications were received, and 4 candidates shortlisted.

2-day process for interviews was proposed.

BC stressed that the Headteacher will be employed by WLP, not NYC. This is because if WS joins WLP, the Headteacher will be assigned to the school. The selection would not be ratified by the governing body of Whitby School, but WLP.

BC invited JB to discuss an alternative plan, should the recruitment be not successful. JB stressed that exceptional progress has been made since the school was created in September. From September, the next phase is an intensive school improvement. JB was keen to retain GD to steer school improvement and appoint a Head of School to take care of the school on the ground.

Governors agreed to appoint a Head of School from September should Headteacher recruitment be not successful.

Question: Governors enquired whether any governors' presence was required on the first day of interviews.

Answer: DG would confirm this, governors can meet the candidates over lunch on Monday.

JC declared interest as she was one of candidates.

	The minutes of meeting held on 20 th May were agreed as accurate record, to be signed by the Chair.

	GD added the cinder track to his morning rotation. Duties have been assigned to cover that area.	

8	Academy status	
	JB reported that WLP is in the process of completing the application form to convert to an academy, to be submitted by the end of academic year. In September WLP will conduct due diligence exercise. The results will be presented to the trustees who will make the final vote.	
	Question: Governors enquired about the bridge at the end of the footpath.	
	Answer: The bridge will not belong to the school. AP will have a meeting with Jon Holden about this. WLP will need more clarity around the bridge, this will be further investigated during the due diligence process.	
	GD - The bridge came out as a result of an Information request, where the school discovered half the bridge belonged to the school. LA offered a free survey on the bridge.	

	Governors were concerned that money for children's education could have to be spent on the upkeep of the bridge.	
	<u>Fencing</u>	
	The project has been approved, school to organise and then invoice NYC.	
	Question: Governors enquired what the fence will do.	
	Answer: The fencing is important to students' safeguarding and road safety.

	WLP - this will be investigated by Jon Holden and WLP are hopeful that this will be funded by NYC.

	GS drew governors' attention to Monthly accounts.
	10.2 School transport
	Change to transport policy made by the LA meant that students from some villages would have more difficulty accessing Whitby School. Governors made commitment to set up a fund to support this transport.
	GD got in touch with the LA.
	Several options were considered. GD recommended that a fund is created which will cover 60% of the bus cost for eligible families.
	Governors discussed the NYC policy, which was expecting a review in early 2026.
	Governors discussed train links and how they could be utilised by parents.
	"Whitby School Board 1st July 2025 Future Savings Options" document was presented.
	Governors discussed options for savings that might be needed if pupil numbers decline.
	General reserve forecast was presented, including assumptions for pupil numbers.

	Answer: GD gave an overview of initiatives that could attract students, including enrichment events.
	Governors discussed the budget prediction position and possible future opportunities.

	Answer: Staff investigated why parents keep students at home. Main reasons were ill health and anxiety. Staff engage with families to improve students' attendance.
	"We're so glad you're here" campaign was running.
	Governor highlighted the importance of educating the parents around the importance of attendance.
	Question: Governors enquired why so many students were being anxious.
	Answer: JC explained that anxiety has become a much bigger part of our society. Resilience has become more important.
