**What do GCSE and Applied
qualifications look like in 2026?**

GCSE exams are linear with more challenging content and exams.

A new 9 (best) to 1 grading system has started in all subjects. Coursework has been cut back (for instance GCSE Maths and English don't involve any) and fewer subjects offer 'tiered' exams.

Practical subjects tend to be weighted more towards exams with coursework counting less.

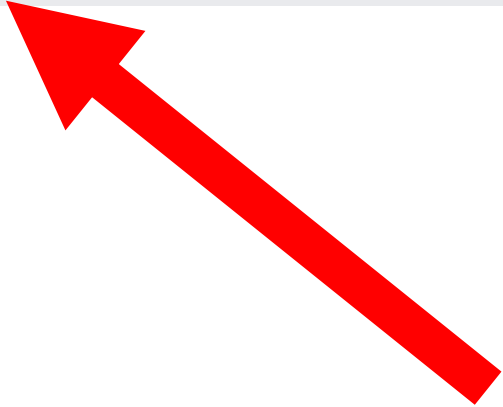
